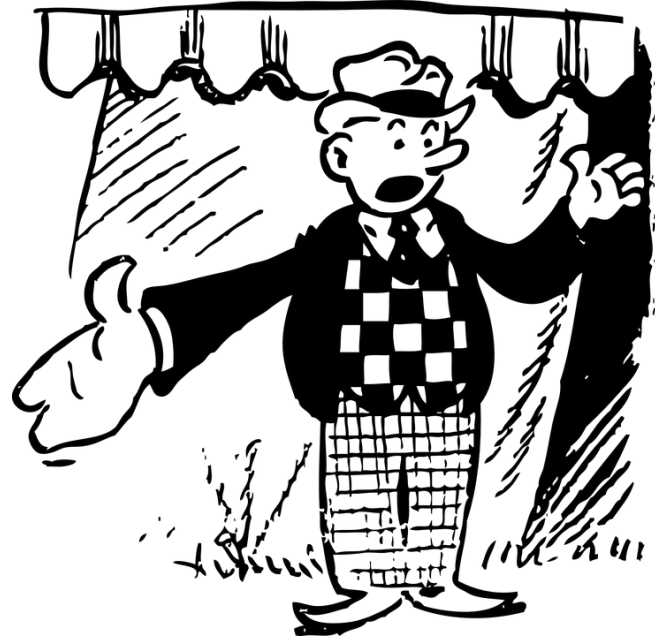

Simply put, the CALEA accreditation process ensures our agency is meeting rigorous national standards to ensure we are providing professional law enforcement service!

When a classic Christmas carol hits you with a new meaning...

I was greatly comforted in the familiar music of this crazy 2021 Christmas season.

There was one moment, one deep and discomfiting moment, when the usual tradition and warmth of the Christmas music suddenly felt strangely awkward. The beautiful, timeless carol “Silent Night” was playing and felt to me like a familiar, cozy blanket. Then, in an instant, this lyric clung to me like a heavy lead weight:

Silent night, holy night!
Son of God love's pure light.
Radiant beams from Thy holy face
With dawn of redeeming grace,
Jesus Lord, at Thy birth
Jesus Lord, at Thy birth



One line jolted my conscience: “With the dawn of redeeming grace.” In this current time of strife and division driven by those who would promote and celebrate differences, grace is the key to redemption and togetherness.

We all need to understand and remember that each of us is unique, created to be individually distinctive. We become less unique, less different, if we allow political and social influencers to define our behaviors. Our uniqueness is blended into obscurity, rather than celebrated when we allow labels to be placed arbitrarily on groups of people.

Every person has an immeasurable worth. Instead of using labels which assign people to groups, we need to exercise the redeeming grace which allows each of us to be unique and independent. We need to use redeeming grace like a shield to prevent the pre-judgement of others to determine our own worth. We should use redeeming grace as a sword to cut through the binding labels and to lead the charge of independence.

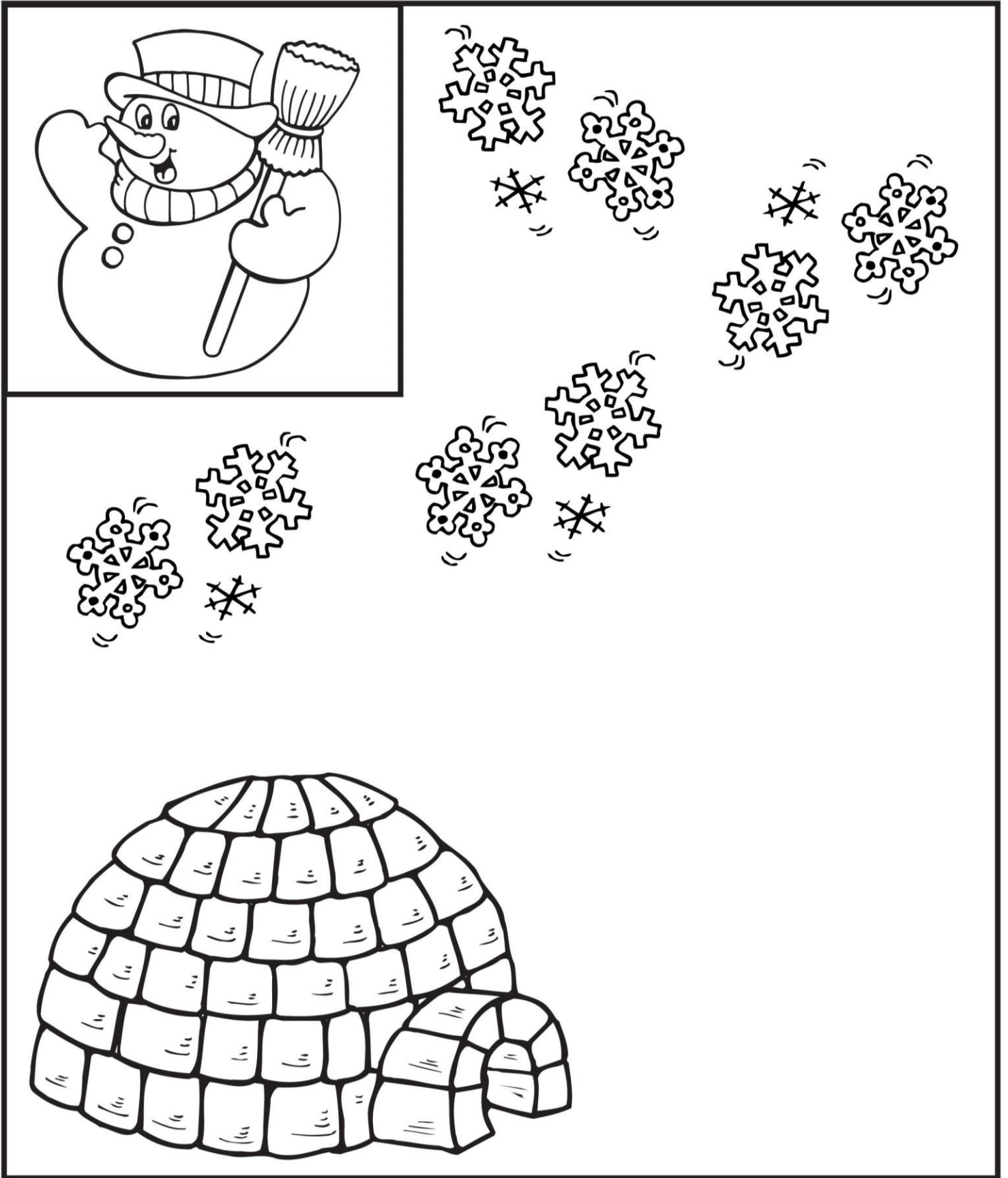
