**Life was simple once.** We are all struggling to navigate this complex world where every day we are bombarded by a deluge of communications, fed a steady stream of opinions, and buffeted by emotionally charged outbursts. I encourage you to harken back to simple principles once taught by elders. #### Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me.

Remember that harsh words often say more about the person speaking than about the person to whom they are spoken. Toughen up and let words roll off your back once in a while. Remember that bullies often use strong words as a way to cover up their own weakness.

#### There is no such thing as a "free lunch".

There REALLY is no such thing. The "free lunch" costs somebody something to provide. I cannot remember the last time that I heard someone else use this saying. This saying was originally developed in the nineteenth century when tavern owners would provide a "free lunch" to drinkers who visited their establishments. The price of the drinks paid for those "free lunches", because there is no such thing as a "free lunch". There was no "free lunch" back then, and this principle is still true today. In today's economy of government hand-outs, this saying should be applied strongly and frequently. This saying should be a reminder that citizenship requires effort and that anyone who promises a "free lunch" most likely has a hidden agenda.

#### Treat others the way you want to be treated.

The "Golden Rule"... I wish our Washington politicians, who often act like children, would keep this principle in mind. So many good lessons are taught around this simple principle. Forgiving others returns forgiveness. Helping others will return help when in need. Sharing a smile returns a smile. It may also be true that treating others with contempt and disrespect will also return the same. So, be kind and generous if you want a happy life.

Before this age of instant electronic communications, overpowered media hype, and unnecessary noise, life was simple. Don't let words offend you. Don't be fooled by a "free lunch". Treat others with kindness and respect. By practicing these principles, we can return to a simpler life and a stronger community.



#### NewsBlaster and HSCBA – February, 2022

I sure hope this month's article finds everyone doing well and surviving winter! With January past us and February to go, one can only hope for an early spring come March!

As a reminder to our citizens, your Sheriff's Office has many statutory obligations outside the normal scope of "patrol" and "investigations." These obligations include; but are not limited to: the process of the Court (also known as "paper service"), registering (and verifying) the location of registered sex offenders throughout the county (including within the municipalities), carry concealed weapon permit issuance/renewals, and the entry/auditing of all criminal warrant s from the state Court system (13<sup>th</sup> Circuit Court of Callaway County).

In example, just this last year, 2021, while conducting process of the Court, our deputies served 2,391 Court documents all across our vast 842 square mile county. These documents covered an array of civil/criminal Court matters; ranging from Court ordered evictions to family protection orders and included everything in-between that is being handled by our civil and criminal Court divisions! In addition to these 2,391 documents that were successfully served, our deputies attempted the service of an additional 641 Court issued documents, however were unable to locate the respondents/defendants due to old addresses or other factors.

Serving the Court, a huge responsibility of the Sheriff, is an honor and keeps the "wheels of the Court system" turning! What many do not realize is; these obligations, such as process of the Court, are not just "out in the county" but inside the municipalities as well. Hence why sometimes citizens ask why they see deputies "in town" so much --- it's due to our statutory obligations we are most proud to have all across the county and even "in-town!"

Likewise in Matthew 23, Jesus denounces the hypocrisy of the Scribes and Pharisees. He proclaims "The Scribes and Pharisees sit on Moses' seat; so, practice and observe whatever they tell you, but not what they do; for they preach but do not practice."

So, with all humility, I encourage all readers to exercise your acts of charity to the full extent of your means. Gifts of cash, food and your time to charitable non-profit organizations will help show your love and kindness for your fellow man. Opportunities for charitable giving abound in our communities. 


